-  **Maintenance advice:** After harvesting, give a formative pruning to even out, harmonize and ventilate branches. At the end of winter, cut off any dead wood.
-  **Botanical/Horticultural origin:** Horticultural origin : chance seedling, discovered by the General Canino, in the Valencia region (ES) around 1900.
-  **Use group:** Fruit Trees
