-  **Maintenance advice:** After harvesting, and only if necessary, give a formative pruning to even out, harmonize and ventilate branches. At the end of winter, cut off any dead wood. Cherry trees are only moderately pruned.
-  **Botanical/Horticultural origin:** Discovered by Leonard Burlat in Lyon, in a hedge in the Gerland neighborhood, Rhone region (FR) 1915
-  **Use group:** Fruit Trees
-  **Height at 10 years:** 6 m
-  **Width at 10 years:** 6 m
-  **Growth:** Fast
-  **Fragrance:** No

-  **Exposure:** Full sun
-  **Evergreen/Deciduous:** Deciduous
