-  **Maintenance advice:** Pruning is often unnecessary but can be done at the end of winter.
-  **Botanical/Horticultural origin:** West China : discovered by Augustine Henry and introduced by Ernest Wilson (GB) 1908
-  **Use group:** Shrubs
-  **Height at 10 years:** 2 m
-  **Width at 10 years:** 1,5 m
-  **Growth:** Medium
-  **Fragrance:** No

-  **Exposure:** Sun - Half shade
-  **Evergreen/Deciduous:** Evergreen
-  **Shape:** rigid, upright
-  **Colour of leaves:** Green
-  **Colour of flowers:** Green yellow
-  **Soil type:** Cool
-  **Uses:** Border, Free standing specimen, Tub/container
