Armand clematis, Clematis armandii var. biondiana



-  **Maintenance advice:** Optional, after flowering. Shorten if necessary. Otherwise, pruning consists of lightening and removing any dead wood. Pruning after flowering will help ramify the plant to keep vegetation growing on the lower branches.
-  **Botanical/Horticultural origin:** China, Myanmar, Vietnam; introduced by Ernest Wilson (GB) 1900
-  **Use group:** Climbers
-  **Height at 10 years:** 6 m
-  **Width at 10 years:** 3 m
